



Memorial Day Honor a Fallen Hero

Next, choose one or both of the following projects to complete in honor of the Fallen Hero of your choice.

Project #1: Design a Fallen Hero Poster

- a. You can create your poster by using the provided template, designing it by hand, or utilizing a computer for your design.

Project #2: Write a Letter to the Family of a Fallen Hero

- a. You can handwrite your letter and include drawings, or you can type it out on a computer. Lined paper is provided at the end of this packet.
- b. Use any of the prompts below to inspire topics for your letter.
- c. Mail your letter to TMF and we will share it directly with the family of the fallen hero.

Letter Writing Suggestions

- Introduce yourself and share that you are learning about their fallen hero through Travis Manion Foundation's Fallen Heroes page. Personalize your letter by including what city and state you reside in, your current grade, and a fun fact.
- Share that this Memorial Day, you chose to honor the legacy of their loved one and wanted to write a letter sharing your gratitude.
- Explain why you chose to learn about their hero in particular.
- Share some things that you and the Fallen Hero have in common. This can be a character strength you share, interests, hobbies, etc.
- Talk about a character strength that you think their Fallen Hero embodied. TMF Character Strengths and definitions can be found on the following page.
- Explain how you are going to put one character strength into action in honor of their loved one. For example:
 - I am going put the character strength of perseverance into action by practicing skills for my sports team.
 - I am going to show the character strength of love to my younger sibling by offering to play a game with them.
- Share with the family what the ethos "If Not Me, Then Who..." means to you.
- Thank the family for sharing about their loved one on Travis Manion Foundation's Fallen Heroes page!

Strength	Definition
Appreciation of Beauty	Drawing inspiration from beauty and excellence
Bravery	Standing firm in a personal value, despite opposition
Creativity	Imagining new and unique ways of thinking or doing things
Curiosity	Being open to experience and knowledge
Fairness	Promoting justice and equality
Forgiveness	Being accepting of people's faults or mistakes
Gratitude	Being thankful for good things in life
Honesty	Being genuine and taking responsibility for one's actions
Hope	Expecting the best and working toward it
Humility	Being modest about one's own accomplishments
Humor	Enjoying making others smile or laugh
Judgment	Examining all sides of an issue before making a decision
Kindness	Taking care of others; being caring, generous, and considerate
Leadership	Motivating a group of people to achieve a goal
Love	Valuing individual relationships with others
Love of Learning	Always adding to one's knowledge and skills
Perseverance	Finishing what you started, despite obstacles and setbacks
Perspective	Having a thoughtful point of view that others seek out
Prudence	Considering outcomes and risks carefully before acting or speaking
Self Regulation	Being mindful of and responsible for one's own emotions and actions
Social Intelligence	Understanding what makes other people tick
Spirituality	Believing in one's purpose in life and place in the universe
Teamwork	Cooperating with others toward a common goal
Zest	Approaching life as an adventure with great enthusiasm

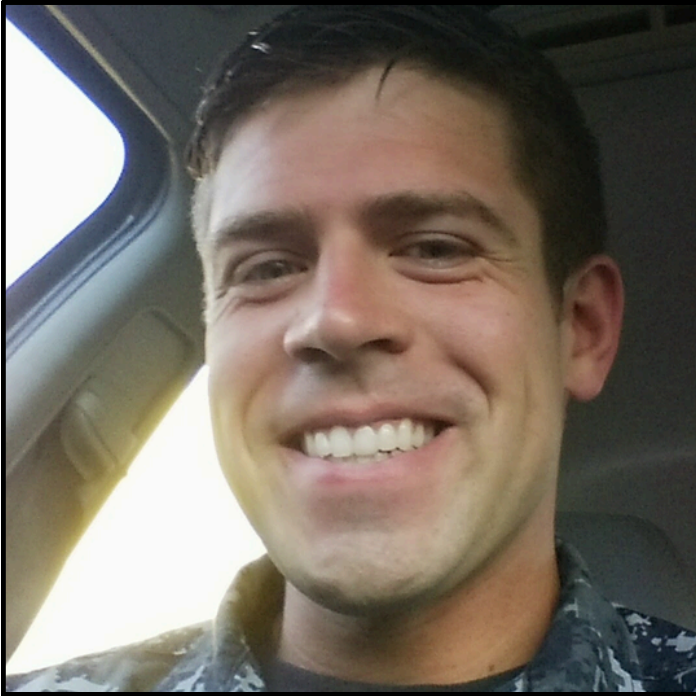
